 - Pre-payment of tuition is required either online or at Catholic High School

Important: COVID -19 Considerations

- All students must wear a mask at all times during summer school on campus. Bring your own mask.
- Classes will be small and students will be social distanced from one another according to governmental guidelines.
- Students must follow social distancing guidelines at all times, including in classrooms, while on break and going to and from vehicles.
- If a student has or is currently being treated for any of the following conditions or if he lives in his immediate household with anyone who falls into the categories, then he is not required to attend the on- campus summer school. In addition, even if these conditions do not apply, any parent who is uncomfortable sending their son to campus is not required to have their son attend on campus. These students will complete summer school through the Teacher Supported Online Learning (TSOL) platform in a synchronous environment, meaning students will be required to be online through Zoom throughout the entire class period.
 - Asthma moderate-to-severe
 - Chronic kidney disease being treated with dialysis
 - Chronic lung disease
 - High blood pressure
 - Diabetes
 - Hemoglobin disorders (e.g. sickle cell, thalassemia)
 - Immunocompromised (e.g. Autoimmune disease, immune suppressing drugs, cancer treatment)
 - Chronic liver disease
 - 65 years and older
 - Serious heart conditions
 - Severe obesity (BMI 40 or higher)

If the student or a family member falls into any of these categories, you must indicate it on the registration form and a member of our training staff will contact you.

Food Availability:

- Due to health regulations regarding school food service during the COVID-19 pandemic, food service is not available at CHS this summer. Students should bring a water bottle with a sealable lid, snack or lunch if necessary.
